The Egyptian writing is called sacred because it was mainly used in temples and tombs. Much of it was carved on stones or walls. Hieroglyphics were a kind of picture writing. They were at first pictures of familiar objects such as the sun, the moon, the sky, the birds, and so on.

Each picture was a sign for the object drawn, and meant no more. Later they were meant not only to stand for the objects drawn, but also to suggest the ideas these objects stand for. For instance, a picture of an arm could be used to represent not only that part of the human body, but also strength. Sometimes the Egyptians combined pictures of two or three objects to represent a new idea. For instance, they had two symbols, one for sky and another for moon, and they combined the two symbols to make a new one for night.

In ancient times such picture writing was used in many countries. Even today it has not completely disappeared from the world. The Chinese, for instance, still have a kind of picture writing. In the beginning the symbols they used were all pictures. These are called characters. Chinese has characters not only for every kind of object, but also for every idea. Very often the characters for two objects are combined to get a character for an idea or thought. For example, it has characters for hand and eye, and these are combined to get the character for look. In spite of all these complications, Chinese is a complete system of writing.

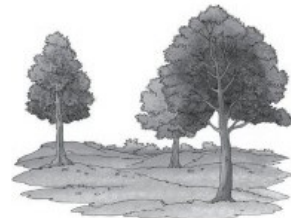
